PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The last two seasons have not proved to be the most successful of seasons in terms of cricket results in the club's history. This is despite being able to build on a largely victorious tour of Great Britain in 1988 and a Poidevin-Gray side which has, some people say, for the last 2 seasons missed out on playing in the final by misfortune rather than bad play. There is obviously no lack of talent in the club.

There has been much soul-searching in an attempt to ascertain the reason for the poor performances of so many players who have real ability. I am encouraged that there does appear to be a commitment to put into action the possible solutions which people have been airing for some time.

One highlight for the club was the honour bestowed on Geoff Lawson in that he can now add the letters "OAM" to his name. The successful conclusion to the Sheffield Shield season is due in no small measure to Henry's efforts. In declaring himself unavailable through injury to captain the team in the Shield final in front of his home crowd, he showed his real character to all cricket followers. Congratulations, Henry.

The Management Committee performed well during the year and it was pleasing to note that towards the end of the season the number of undergraduates actively involved in organising club activities increased. The usual thanks go to Peter Godber (Secretary) and Peter Jourdain (Treasurer), who have both agreed to continue in those positions. Andrew Shaw, with the aid of a LINK paper, performed the onerous job of Team Secretary with distinction. Mike Phillips was equally successful in getting 6th grade into the paddock - without the aid of a pager! The addition of a 7th grade under his charge may test his prowess in this regard.

The ladies team played creditably in its first season, with more success than I think the men thought would result. Congratulations to Joy Van Ardenne for topping the Associations averages for both batting and bowling in the 3rd grade competition. With more coaching from the men, especially those playing higher grades, will help them enormously.

The club is fortunate to have the support of a co-operative and hard working Sports Association. The three grounds are among the best in the competition. The complex at David Phillips, is extremely beneficial to the Club and enhances our position in the New South Wales Cricket Association, as it enables us to host such representative fixtures as the Australian Under 19 and Under 17 Championships. The Village Green, judged the 4th best prepared oval in the competition by the umpires, is one of the few Sydney ovals capable of having a 4 day representative fixture - a tribute to the Ground Staff and the Sports Association.

This was my last season as President after a relatively short but very enjoyable stint of 4 years. Thank you to all those who have assisted the cub in that time and I hope that the new President receives as much assistance from the Committee as I did.

FIRST GRADE REPORT

A season of 4 wins, 5 draws and 6 losses could be read in any number of ways. However, read in conjunction with our performances for the last several years all that can really be said is that the 1st Grade side have consistently performed, at best, as an average 1st Grade team.

This is obviously disappointing to all involved in the club. However it is a situation that must be resolved immediately to restore the club to the heights obtained between 1975/76 and 1982/83. This requires many changes to attitudes and approaches of the current first grade players and all those aspiring to play first grade. It appears that people do not understand the level of commitment required to perform at this level. Until we get 11 first grade players (with appropriate depth in the lower grades) who are willing to devote each season that they are playing to their cricket we will not consistently perform at our peak and accordingly win games. This means constructive training at least twice a week, much higher levels of fitness which will improve our concentration and enable sustained performance for the entire 6 hours of the cricket day, and a willingness to develop greater teammanship through more involvement in the club's social and other activities.

The season did have some high points, namely Jungle. Other than Jungle individual performances of note were too few and far between to really contribute to the overall team performance.

Jamie started the season on fire with a sensational 180* in the second game against Petersham but then had to wait until round 10 to register a score of more than 20. The side relies on Jamie's undoubted ability with the bat, particularly as an opener, and unfortunately he couldn't come through with the goods consistently. 539 runs at 41.46 is nevertheless above average. With consistency it could have been a club record performance. Jamie's bowling was ordinary but hopefully this is a temporary lapse as his leg spinners on their day will win matches.

Shawy's season doesn't look great on paper, averaging only 18 and being dropped down the order at the end of the season to gain some lost confidence. It must be said however that Shawy (and to a lesser extent Jamie) was the victim of many "dubious" decisions in the first half of the season and if you aren't given a chance to stay in the middle you can't play yourself into form. Shawy is a player who's commitment can't be questioned but perhaps his training methods and application need to be improved.

Livo remains one of our mainstays but unfortunately he and Jungle won't be around forever. We need players to perform and commit themselves as Jungle and Livo have and come into the side to maintain our force in Sydney Grade Cricket. Livo was again a victim of some shuffling in the batting order but was third in the averages and generally consistent. A couple

of hundreds is all he's missing because a player of his ability should have scored more than 3 centuries in 14 seasons. Apparently Livo had a bowl as well.

Jungle - 655 runs at 59.54 (Club Record) and 24 wickets at 26.25. His stats speak for themselves. If Jungle were to retire I think the first grade side would fail to win a game on current performance. Perhaps Jungle too should score more tons but that really is a criticism just for the sake of criticising scores of 112*, 92, 76*, 75*, 49, 48, 47, and 35 batting at No. 4 in games structured as they are in grade cricket is more than enough.

Pratty is a player of obviously enormous ability, no more so evident than in his fielding which I believe is unparalleled in NSW cricket. Pratty's batting was disappointing overall, mainly because of his inability to get through those 20's, 30's and 40's. Perhaps it is purely psychological and I'm sure when that first ton comes there will be more, and certainly a higher level of consistent scores. Pratty's bowling seems to lack the variety and strike power of his early years but will be important to the side given the make up of our attack.

Our middle order was filled with many names during the season. Unfortunately few successes arose which may be attributable to our "rushing" of young players with potential. Of the assortment of players the oldest was undoubtedly the most successful. Chemical is pretty old and all that experience saw him score 161 runs in 7 innings at an average of 32.2. His innings against Sutherland is most memorable and given a smooth season and peak physical condition (as a result of "putting in" at footy training) it would seem that Chemical may very well be our middle order answer. Duncan played 8 games and never really fired. When it looked as though he would win us a game (ie Hawkesbury) he unfortunately threw his innings away. A greater level of commitment and thought involving his game should see Duncan developing into a more than adequate first grade batsman. Unfortunately, Duncan tends to go to sleep in the field and for a youngster is not particularly agile. These areas require some attention. Matt Boyer ("the legend") arguably possesses more natural ability than any player who has represented the club. His fielding and batting (and also to a lesser extent his bowling) possess awesome potential and we would hope that it would not be long before his potential is realised. "The Fridge", Warren Faulkner and Springa all played a limited number of first grade games and all have undeniable ability. Unfortunately Springa was lured overseas and yet again has been unable to convince his peers of his first grade capabilities. Both Warren and Fridge are well aware that they can play first grade and need no reminding of the particular efforts required from them in order to achieve higher goals.

Which brings me to the keepers. Although the club is arguably playing 1st grade with less than 11 genuine 1st grade players, there is no denying that there are at least 2 genuine 1st grade wicket-keepers but unfortunately only one position.

Both Kurly and Stan would be among the top 6 or 7 keepers in Sydney and hopefully their rivalry will spur each to higher levels of performance. It is always a very difficult decision as to who deserves the 1st grade spot and always produces keen discussion at selection meetings. Both players are among the few in the club who currently are capable of higher honours (with some alterations to their attitudes and on-field actions).

Whitey was a success story both on and off the field. The move to give him some time in 2nds late last year and early this season we feel has paid enormous dividends. Whitey has displayed in his return to 1st grade, the ability to bowl well on a much more consistent basis. His bowling to Rod Bower and Jamie Bray were particularly impressive. Whitey's fielding is definitely improving and no-one tries harder or is more committed for the club.

Henry was only around for a couple of games this year and really it should have been less than that (Bob Simpson must like to see us at full strength as much as possible). Henry is undoubtedly the most constructive and intuitive captains in the country and each and every club member should seek to learn as much as possible from our own A.O.M.

Big Clem's bowling was at all times k"what the doctor ordered". In fact Clem is now very close to being a regular member of the 1st grade side, even with Henry available. Again, Clem's efforts are as great as anyones and his commitment and willingness to learn should be adopted by a lot more of the younger club players.

Big Al made his 1st grade debut in the last game against Sydney Uni and bowled very well in their second innings. His nervous start on the first innings "wetty" I hope will only provide a lesson to him. Big Al has put in the work and effort and hopefully will be rewarded with future first grade appearances.

Morgs showed up. Apparently some bloke called Perger also showed up.

Anyway, here's to next season and let's all, first and lower grade players, resolve to provide the commitment and effort to games and particularly training that will restore our club to its rightful position at the top of the competition tables.

SECOND GRADE REPORT

Our record of two wins, 1 draws, one wash-out and 10 losses was a disappointing one for a season which promised so much after the excellent performances of the previous season's third grade and P.G. sides. A number of factors helped contribute to generally poor performances, particularly since the Christmas break.

- A large number of players unavailable due to injury and other reasons
- Regular and often late minute team changes
- Poor attendance at training
- Lack of experience
- Lack of commitment/belief in our own ability and so the list goes on

Notwithstanding the above comments, I can't but point out how different the season could have been!!! After round 8 we had won 2 games, drawn 1 and lost 5 and of the 5 losses, 3 could have, with a bit of luck, very easily gone our way (and 2 of these teams were this year's grand finalists). Next season we'll make our own luck.

The season had a number of highlights:-

- A sensational win against Balmain chasing 304 in 88 overs after they bated 40 minutes into day 2. After being 4/136 a superb innings of 83 by Warren Faulkner and a whirlwind 44 not out by Stan Back at the finish gave us a convincing win with 2 overs to spare.

- A real team effort against Waverley saw us declare 45 minutes into day 2 at 9/254. No real heroes but scores of between 20 and 48 to each of our first 6 batsmen, some good partnerships and some healthy hitting by Big Al and Greggy at the finish. We then rolled them for 172 with Shorty and John "Psycho" Lupton each taking 3 early wickets and Sinkers devastating the tail with 4/12 off 5.5 overs.

- A massive 5 dec. for 352 off 92 overs on day 1 of the season with Fridge a superb 171, Duncan Coots 88, and together a record 3rd wicket partnership for 2nd grade of 216 in 175 minutes. Unfortunately a couple of dropped catches and tons to 2 Manly players who ended up playing most of the season in firsts saw the impossible happen with Manly 6/354 at the end of day 2 (in spite of Clem's 6/83 off 29 overs).

- A 2 run loss to Mosman (not really a highlight) in a "one Dayer" when we did everything right except take home the 6 points. The boundary that never was in the 3rd last over when Warren Faulkner (who dominated again with 85) played a delightful pull shot into Umpire Tony "Terry Towelling" Kingsford-Smiths shin for no runs (and a trip to hospital later in the week for Tony) will be hard to forget for a long time.

The Players

Like our overall team performance, our ground fielding in particular was disappointing and generally our players did not appear to have their minds on the game for the entire time. A bright spot was the close in catching of Sinkers-15 for the season which I believe is only 1 off a club record for a non-keeper. A great effort, particularly after missing 2 games through injury.

With respect to wicket-keeping it was a pleasure to have a player of Kurly's talents behind the stumps for the majority of the season. He really is an inspiration wherever he plays and I enjoyed having him as part of the team. Stan Back, Warren Faulkner and Dave Little also made brief appearances with the gloves during the season.

On to batting, the Fridge started off the season with a fine 171 as mentioned earlier. Unfortunately he was unable to reproduce that form for the rest of the season which included a short stint in firsts.

Duncan Coats also started the season with a bang and had an average of 187 after 2 games before spending the majority of the remainder of the season in firsts.

Neither Sinkers or Tim Grosser ever quite reached the levels they are capable of and consistently got out between 20 and 40 when a big score was there for the taking and the team needed it! In fact the same could be said of virtually all of our batsmen. We've just got to make those big scores happen next year. Sinkers also bowled well with limited opportunity and on 2 occasions took vital breakthroughs and then wrapped up the tail.

It was a real pleasure to see Matt Boyer shine through some disappointing team performances and demonstrate he has the talent to play a higher level of cricket. His 2nd grade debut of 88 not out in over 3 hours to give us an honourable draw against North Sydney after being 6/112 was a flawless innings to be remembered for a long time. He also played a number of other good innings as wickets tumbled around him. Matt was our most consistent and reliable batsmen and a good fielder who deserved his call to firsts for the last couple of games.

Warren Faulkner also played a couple of great knocks mid season and unselfishly sacrificed hundreds on 2 occasions looking for quick runs. Unfortunately later season fitness problems and lack of practice saw a disappointing end of season for a guy with natural ability to burn.

Turning to bowling, we saw some excellent early season performances from Clem and Whitey before both ended up in firsts, Clem for virtually the whole season and Whitey from round 7. We sorely missed the penetration provided by these two players.

Big Al McAllum was the club's big improver who by the end of

the season was also bowling a good second (or third) spell late in the day. The improvement was due to (and all club members should note) enthusiasm, a willingness to listen and learn, commitment and most of all practice-long, hard sessions in the nets twice a week virtually every week of the season which saw A1 pick up 4/45 in round 10 and a fine 5/47 off 24 overs against Randwick in the second last round before making his debut in firsts in the final round.

Shorty bowled well at times and it was pleasing to see him rip through Sydney University's top order on a responsive track in the last round. However he will have to work hard to improve his consistency in line and length to make a significant impact at this level or higher. Shorty also played a couple of excellent support innings during the season and it would be good to see a couple of those 20's turned into bigger scores next year.

Our spinners, Mike Gregg and later in the season Santi Pal, both bowled very tightly but struggled to pick up the vital wickets. Both averaged only 2.6 runs per over, Greggy off 194 and Santi 87 overs. Greggy also picked up a couple of useful catches during the season including a vital reflex 1 hander at silly mid on against Waverley.

John Lupton, Dave Gallop, Matt Boyer, Glen Clarke and at the end of the season Atticus Fleming and Dave Trafford also bowled well during limited appearances.

A special mention also goes to our scorer for most of the season, Mrs Coots, for doing such a good job even when the statistics were at times far from encouraging, and also to our groundsmen for providing excellent facilities throughout the season.

In concluding, we simply can not afford to sit back and accept our disappointments of 1989/90. We must use them as the incentive to prove our true talents in 1990/91. This will require every player to be fully fit and totally committed at training and on-field performance. By maximising individual performances with the bat, ball and in the field, we will see improved team performances, more wins, improved team and club spirit and a much more rewarding record of achievement when we sit down to analyse our performances in 12 months time.

Finally thanks to all the players who appeared in the second grade side during the year, with particular mention of last years skipper, Jacky Jourdain, who started the season as captain before an unfortunate car accident saw Jacky miss a couple of games and finish the season in the lower grades.

THIRD GRADE REPORT

The team for the first round was substantially different from that which played in the semi-final the previous year. It was a very young side which has its advantages in that the side was very enthusiastic and extremely good in the fielding department.

However a couple of early losses due to inexperience and lack of discipline by the batsmen set the side off to a poor start to the season. We "escaped from jail" in the game against North Sydney where we were bundled out for less than 160 and in the end, through excellent bowling by Dave Simpson and Mark Lollback took 7-15 to win by 10 runs.

We were unfortunate to have to play on three grounds which were, quite frankly, totally unsuitable for cricket at any level. We won one and lost 2. We had some good wins before Christmas, such as the games against North Sydney and Balmain. However towards the end of the season we were playing far more consistently.

Bowlers were able to bowl to a plan; medium pacers like Bruce Christie and Atticus Fleming were bowling at off stump and varying their pace (It is very hard to cut or swing an old ball after tea on DP South!). Batsmen started to prize their wickets, to play within their capabilities. I "Ram", Rob McLaughlin and Brad Schirmer are three batsmen who will be much better players for their experiences last season.

I think there is a lesson there for future fourth grade captaine.

Overall I enjoyed the challenge of being captain and felt that all season I had the support of all the players. The players in their first season quickly fitted in, both on and off the field. I hope that every player felt that they had a worthwhile season.

For next year I feel that we need to keep four players fairly consistently in the side so a little more stability can be achieved and the players coming in and out can have a side that they feel they can quickly fit into. The demise of the green hut and the opening of the new grandstand and tearooms next year will make D.F. a very friendly place to spend ones Saturday afternoon.

FIFTH GRADE REPORT

The 1989-90 season proved to be somewhat less successful than 1988-89. Despite a promising start, which included four wins in the first seven matches, the team was unable to improve on this record for the remainder of the season.

A brief perusal of the match results indicates that the inability to reach, or to set, reasonable targets was the major identifiable factor in the team's indifferent performances. This is supported by the summary of batting performances (individual and partnerships) which saw only one century scored and no century partnerships.

The raw figures are deceptive, however, as on several occasions our bowlers made good headway defending totals of less than 150. Indeed, no complaints could be made about their efforts on most occasions. A small amount of luck and a little inspirational fielding could well have seen wins against Gordon, Hawkesbury and Campbelltown.

Despite these close shaves, it would be unrealistic to deny that, for the most part, the team was often outplayed by opposition which was better prepared or keener to win. As Captain, I found it unsatisfactory in the extreme to win the toss in the knowledge that only seven or eight players were present to take the field. The tendency throughout the club for players to choose their matches (or starting times) and withdraw with little notice was felt heavily towards the bottom of the club. Despite the best efforts of M. Phillips and the Team Secretary, the Fifths were too often too few or too late. Shawy's effort in sending the whole eleven, punctual for once, to the wrong ground was something of a high point in the Club's organisation!!

The attached list of players' statistics reveals that 36 players turned out in Fifth Grade for the season past. The list emphasises appearances rather than performances and indicates those players who were willing to commit themselves over a major part of the season. The number of players who "disappeared" after playing early in the season was disappointing and, no doubt, deprived the team of useful playing strength when it was most needed around Christmas.

On an individual level, few players could be said to have been outstanding; however, it was encouraging to see that because of, or perhaps in spite of, the policy of promotion on performance, some players progressed to higher grades and performed creditably. Most notable among these were Ram, George Sendall, Adam Licudi, Don Kesby and Lachlan Taylor.

Consistency was the major shortcoming in the side but, on this score, Greig Robinson was the exception, dominating the bowling crease with a mixture of slow ones and long ones. His figures speak for themselves, as did his batting figures on occasions. His partnerships with Simon Payne became a feature and, at times, a necessity at the end of innings and resulted in one record performance for the ninth wicket. Well done, Robbo and Simon.

Other players were less successful individually but contributed all the same. Steve Lopes was the team stalwart and sometimes portrait artist, who combined gutsy batting, bowling and fielding into a good overall performance. Grant Lovett combined glimpses of good batting with the latest in basketball wear; while Rob Stark, true to form, bowled and batted well on occasions, and at times induced the opposition to play the man rather than the ball.

It only remains for me to thank all the players who played for the Fifths and those persons behind the scenes who strove, with varying degrees of skill and success, to put eleven players on the park each week.
