# **Individual Profile**

Where were you born and where did you grow up?

Born February 1950 and grew up in Dulwich Hill.

Where did you play your junior/local cricket or become interested in cricket? I played school cricket (Marrickville West Primary and Enmore Boys High), Green Shield and a couple of 4th Grade games with Petersham-Marrickville 1965/6; then 2 seasons of Church cricket on 'the mats' until I arrived at UNSW in 1968.

When and why did you become involved with UNSWCC?

My first season was 1968/9. I wanted to see how I'd go playing better cricket back on turf wickets and wanted to have a wider involvement in university life.

What did you like about UNSW Cricket?

The welcoming attitude of so many in the Club from day 1 and the camaraderie that developed from then on. There were many other undergraduate players and even the older players had something in common with the younger generation - the university experience, which meant everyone got on no matter the difference in age or cricket ability. There were/are many 'interesting' characters.

What is your Club nickname (Explain who gave it to you and why – if not obvious) **Robbo - has been all my life for a very obvious reason.**

Being committed to the Club ie not missing games, always giving 100% (eg trying to stay not out when batting after the 2nd Grade Captain, Terry Buddin, told me as No. 11 my job was to not get out while the other [better?] batsman scored more runs!) and being willing to help out off the field. What did it mean to you to be awarded life membership?

I was surprised but delighted - I hoped I deserved to be included among the other terrific Club people who are Life Members.

What is your greatest memory or memories of UNSW Cricket?

People - lots of them - the talented, the wonderful, the weird, the intelligent and a couple who were possibly not from this planet - so many terrific people. The 2nd Grade Premiership season and taking a hat trick in my first game in the team. From earlier days, the 2 A Shires premierships and inter-varsity cricket, especially the 3 day games.

In what profession or area of work are/were you mainly involved? What are your main interests outside cricket?

My only career was in teaching - mainly teaching English. I still do a little tutoring of HSC students. I am still interested in (watching) sport, I collect Australian stamps, enjoy reading and going to plays, movies and eateries with family and friends and catching up with other UNSWCC 'old-timers'.
